2010 First Robotics Competition

This year's competition is a game called **Breakaway**. In it, two alliances, one red and one blue, each comprised of 3 robots, are trying to score balls into their team's goals. The balls are standard size 5 soccer balls, much like you'd see on a professional field. Robots are tasked with rolling these balls along the ground and kicking, hitting, or otherwise sending the ball into their goal. Each goal counts for one point apiece. Much like real soccer, balls cannot be picked up by the robots, or there will be a penalty. The field is 54 feet by 27 feet and has two bumps running through midpoints on the field, one red and one blue. There is a 15 second "Autonomous Mode"

where the robots run off of pre-programmed commands. After this period is over, drivers step up and begin the teleoperated period, which is 120 seconds long. This is the time where the drivers control their robot and try to score goals themselves. Of course, teams may not necessarily make it a priority to score, but rather to play defense and prevent the other teams from scoring.

During the last 20 seconds of the teleoperated period, the "Finale" starts. This is when robots are encouraged to get on the tower located at the center of each bump. Robots can latch onto the bars at the top of the tower, and suspend themselves for two bonus points. Additionally, another robot can suspend themselves from a hanging robot for 3 additional points, for a total of 5 potential bonus points.

Part of the challenge this year is being able to traverse the bumps to get into the other zones and the fact that there can only be one of each

alliance's robots in their opponent's zone at a time--meaning robots cannot come to "back each other up." To get Team 501's opinion on this year's game, I interviewed Anna Turgeon, one of this year's team captains.

Connor: How do you feel about this year's game?

Anna: I like how it's easier for spectators to understand, since the scoring system is simpler as opposed to other years.

Connor: What sort of strategies do you think we need to have?

Anna: We'll probably want to be able to cross bumps quickly, and score from far distances, as well as being able to hang during the finale.

Connor: There are a lot of penalties that can be given this year. Do you think this will make the game more difficult than past years?

Anna: Every game has its

challenges, but I think we'll need to be a lot more conscious of the rules this year.

Connor: What do you think is the ideal robot design for this year's competition, and which strategy will be most important?

Anna: Since hanging scores a lot of points, it's going to be a big priority, as well as potentially having the ability to flip other team's robots that have turned over in the match.

Connor: Finally, what do you think will be the most fun part of build this year?

Anna: To me, the most fun part of build, no matter what year, is always the forming of a tight community around the building of the robot, almost like a second family.

This year's competition is being held from March 4th through March 6th at the Verizon Wireless Arena, and Team 501 hopes to see you there!
